INSTRUCTIONS FOR SURGERY

You must be in an optimum state of health before surgery so post-operative complications are minimized.

Smoking is harmful to the outcome of your surgery. You must stop smoking at least 6 weeks prior to your surgery. You must eliminate passive smoke or second hand smoke exposure. You should not smoke for at least 6 weeks after surgery. Please contact our office if this is a problem.

Do not eat or drink anything after midnight or within 8 hours of your surgery. Medications can be taken with a sip of water. See the following pages for medicines to avoid prior to surgery.

Please have all your informed consent materials signed and dated prior to your procedure. These are given to the doctor at a second consultation or office visit. Any additional questions can be answered at a second consultation. You are encouraged to see Dr. Seballos at a second consultation, should you have any further questions or concerns.

The Day of Surgery

Arrange someone to stay at home with the patient on the first night at home.

Remove all makeup, jewelry, piercings, nail polish, hair spray or mousse, etc. before coming to the hospital or surgery center.

Contacting Dr. Seballos

Medications to Avoid Prior to Surgery

Anticoagulants and Antiplatelet Agents, such as COUMADIN, WARFARIN, DIPYRIDAMOLE OR PERSANTINE, HEPARIN, LOVENOX, TICLOPIDINE (TICLID), TRENTAL, PLAVIX AND PLETAL, WILL BE STOPPED AS DIRECTED BY YOUR ODERING PHYSICIAN A FEW DAYS PRIOR TO YOUR SURGERY.

The following drugs either contain aspirin and/or have undesirable side effects that may affect your surgery (abnormal bleeding and bruising). These drugs should be avoided for 14 DAYS prior to surgery. If you need to take something for relief of minor pain, you may take Tylenol.
