Pre-operative and Post-operative Instructions for Local Anesthesia Surgery

- 1. If you are taking a blood thinner, you should check with your doctor if you can be off it for 4-5 days before surgery. (Such as coumadin/warfarin)
- 2. You should not take motrin, aspirin, ibuprofen, and herbal medications or any over the counter drug that will promote bleeding (see list below).
- 3. Since you will be strictly local anesthesia, you can eat a light breakfast. Avoid a big meal or heavy meal before any surgery. Any anesthesia such as sedation, regional block, or general anesthesia will require that you not eat for a minimum of 8 hours before surgery. That includes any liquid or solid food.
- 4. Medications can be taken preop with a minimal of water ie. sips.
- 5. It is a good idea not to drive your self to the hospital even for local procedures. Make arrangements to have someone drive you home.
- 6. Dressing instructions are generally given after the procedure. They will vary depending on the size, location, and extent of the surgery completed.
- 7. Be sure to call and schedule for follow-up visits. It is always good to confirm appointments.
- 8. Smoking is bad for healing and should be stopped before and after surgery. Passive or second hand smoke also can result in poor or delayed healing.

Medications to Avoid Prior to Surgery

Anticoagulants and Antiplatelet Agents, such as COUMADIN, WARFARIN, DIPYRIDAMOLE OR PERSANTINE, HEPARIN, LOVENOX, TICLOPIDINE (TICLID), TRENTAL, PLAVIX AND PLETAL, WILL BE STOPPED AS DIRECTED BY YOUR ODERING PHYSICIAN A FEW DAYS PRIOR TO YOUR SURGERY.

The following drugs either contain aspirin and/or have undesirable side effects that may affect your surgery (abnormal bleeding and bruising). These drugs should be avoided for 14 DAYS prior to surgery. If you need to take something for relief of minor pain, you may take Tylenol.
